Know all men by these presents that I Sally Bray of Southampton County and State of Virginia for and in consideration of the natural love and affection which I bear to John Bruster son of Sally Bruster of the County and State aforesaid as well as for the Consideration of one dollar to me so lawfully paid by the said John Bruster or before the making and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have given granted and by these presents do give and grant unto and the said John Bruster his heirs Executors and assigns one certain parcel of land situate being the same whereon I now reside Containing more or less by estimation to be the same more or less as being all the land which my late husband John Bruster purchased of the heirs of Peter Branch dec'd late of Southampton County to receive the same at my death and to have and to hold the said Land unto him the said John Bruster his heirs Executors and assigns forever and the said Sally Bray for herself her heirs Executors and assigns the said Land unto him the said John Bruster his Executors Administrators and assigns against the Claim of her the said Sally Bruster after her the said Sally's death her heirs Executors and assigns and against the Claim or claims of all and every other person or persons whomsoever shall and will warrant and forever defend them by these presents On Writings whereof the said Sally Bruster hath hereunto set her hand and seal this 19th day of Jan^y 1834.
