This Indenture made the 22nd day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty five between Samuel Braswell and Mary his wife of Southampton County in the State of South Carolina of the one part and Thomas Trotter of Southampton County in the State of Virginia of the other parts witnesseth that the said Samuel Braswell and Mary his wife in consideration of the hundred and two dollars and fifty cents of lawful money of the Commonwealth to them in hand paid by the said Thomas Trotter at & before the writing hereof and delivery hereof unto the receipt whereof a duly acknowledged receipt hereunto and sold and sold out of them as a bargain and sale unto the said Thomas Trotter his heirs and assigns a certain tract or parcel of land or lands and bounded as follows Beginning at a black Elm on Carroll's line and a said Thomas Trotter's line thence N 13 W 32 Pole to a pine thence N 20 W 16 Pole to a pine thence N 61 1/2 W 10 poles to a pine thence N 77 1/2 W 16 poles to a pine a corner on Edgar's line thence N 88 E 38 poles to a red oak thence N 25 E 64 poles to a pine thence N 26 E 16 poles to a red oak thence N 6 E 74 poles to a red oak thence N 36 E 27 poles to a pine a corner on the Wade's land thence down said land past the second corner being and bounding thence 25 1/2 poles to the mouth of a small brook crossing Thomas Trotter's line of said branch 155 W 9 poles to the beginning containing together one acre more or less the corner and meadow remains and remains and every part and parcel thereof to have and to hold the said tract or parcel of Land with the tenements heretofore and all and singular other the premises herein before mentioned or intended to be bargained and sold and every part and parcel thereof with every of their rights members and appurtenances unto the said Thomas Trotter his heirs assigns forever to and for the only purposes and use of off from the said Thomas Trotter his heirs and assigns forever and the said Samuel Braswell and Mary his wife for themselves and their heirs the said tract or parcel of Land with all and singular the premises and appurtenances before mentioned unto the said Thomas Trotter his heirs and assigns free from the claim or claims of them the said Samuel Braswell and Mary his wife or either of them their or either of their heirs and of all and every other person or persons whatsoever shall or shall be or shall be hereafter by their presents or otherwise touching the said Samuel Braswell and Mary his wife their heirs and assigns their heirs and shall the day and year first above written
