This Indenture made this 15th day of December Eighteen hundred and three, the day hereinafter
 witness and Party the wife of the said Charles Bates of the other part witness and Party the wife of the said Jonathan
 Benjamin Bates and Party his wife for and in consideration of the sum of Eight hundred
 dollars to them in hand paid by the said Charles Bates at or before the execution and delivery
 of these presents the receipt whereof the said Jonathan Bates and Party has affixed his mark acknowledging
 that he granted bargained sold alienated and confirmed unto the said Charles Bates his heirs and assigns
 forever one certain tract or parcel of land lying and being in the County of Southampton
 containing by estimation two hundred and fifty acres of land the same more or less it
 being the tract of land that John Mabell sold to the said Benjamin Bates and Company after
 total beginning at the mouth of White Rock Branch on the bank of Peete's Mill Pond thence up
 the said branch to a black Gum a corner of said land and the said of Rock branch
 thence bending on said Rock branch line S.E. 100 feet from the said Rock branch to a black
 oak tree S.E. 100 feet to a pine corner of said land Benjamin Drayton and William
 Evans and hence S.E. 100 feet to the south fork of Rock branch thence down the said
 branch to the head of Peete's Mill Pond thence up the said pond to the beginning
 together with all ways water or such course thereunto belonging as all the estate appertaining
 thereto with all the appurtenances thereunto belonging to the said Charles Bates his heirs
 and assigns forever to the only proper use and behoof of him the said Charles Bates his heirs
 assigns forever and the said Benjamin Bates and Party his wife for themselves and their
 children and posterity to have and to use and to enjoy the same during their
 lives and after their deaths to the said Charles Bates and his heirs and assigns but to
 use and to defend the right and title of the above said tract or parcel of land
 against themselves their heirs and every other person whatsoever unto the said Charles Bates
 and his heirs forever given under our hands and sealed the day and year above
