doth partly in debt unto the said David Wallace in the sum of One thousand One hundred and Seventy Dollars and Seventy  
Pennies unto his note or Specie bill bearing even date with this present and also on his further sum of One  
Thousand and Two hundred and Sixty One Pennies due by note or Specie bill bearing date the 17<sup>th</sup> day of April 1820  
coupled to Harry Corp with Henry Gurney Security which said note is affixed by the said Harry Corp  
to Richard Atkinson and by Power Transfer Co. to the proprietor of the said David Wallace as his  
own right and property and which said note is entituled to a credit of Fifty dollars unpaid per  
on the 20 November 1823 and a further credit of Fifty dollars paid the 6 July 1823
