

In the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty four James Richelle his heirs Executors or administrators shall at any time at the request of the said David Wallance or his heirs Executors or administrators or at the request of the said John T. Blon his heirs Executors or administrators shall proceed to sell the slaves Negro Slaves or Servants thereof as may be sufficient to pay and satisfy the aforesaid debts interest and costs after paying the legal publick charges of the same and the sale of same at the Court House door of the County and as many other places as the said Charles Richelle may think necessary at Publick Auction to the highest bidder for cash and out of the proceeds of such Sales pay and satisfy to the said David Wallance the aforesaid debts interest and costs and also the cost of removing his said wife and all children and charges attending said sale and the expenses of same pay to the said John T. Blon his heirs Executors or administrators and the said John T. Blon for himself his heirs Executors or administrators former minister and defend the right and title of me and to the aforesaid negro slaves and every of them unto him the said James Richelle against all and every other person whatsoever In witness whereof the parties to these presents have hereunto set their hands and affixed their seals this day and year first above written or before written
