This Indenture made this first day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty three between James Prepsford of Southampton County and State of Virginia of the first part and Samuel Pardner of the second part and Samuel Daugherty of the third part of the said County and State of Virginia do hereby certify that whereas the above named James Prepsford did on the first day of September one thousand eight hundred and twenty three execute his bond to the above named Samuel Pardner for the sum of thirty dollars with interest from the date moreover whereas the above bond James Prepsford is willing and desirous to indemnify and secure the said Samuel Pardner to secure the said debt but more especially for the sum of one dollar to him on hand paid by the said Samuel Daugherty before the making and delivery of these presents do grant bargain sell let over and deliver to him the said Samuel Daugherty the within money properly lawfully due him on his and sometimes his wife and heirs upon the following to wit to wit on the said property to remain in the hands of the said Samuel Prepsford until called for by the said Samuel Daugherty that is to say that if the said James Prepsford should fail to pay or discharge the said debt or any part thereof it shall be the duty of him the said Samuel Daugherty to behoove himself to the highest bidder for the property above named or so much thereof will satisfy the said debt but if all reasonable charges for money after advertising the said property or due from the redemption of the said Prepsford at least ten days to wit money when the parties have known set on hand and shall this day and date be so written
