This Indenture made the 15<sup>th</sup> day of January in the year of our said Lord King's fourth and twenty first between Amos Johnson the debtor of the first part Benjamin Griffin the second part and Allen Edwards Esquire of the third part all of the County of Southampton & parish of St. Mary, whereas the said Amos Johnson is partly indebted unto the said Allen Edwards in the sum of one hundred dollars to be paid on the first day of September 1824 due by law beyond on the same day, which debt with the legal interest of any kind he the said Amos Johnson is willing and desirous to discharge from the Indenture with full third for and unconsumed of the sum of one dollar of lawful money of England to the said Amos Johnson in hand paid by the said Benjamin Griffin the said Amos Johnson before the entering and delivering of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by the said Amos Johnson shall give grant and bargain and sell and confirm to the said Benjamin Griffin his heirs and assigns from the following property to wit Three horses three head Cattle twenty five barrels Corn three fathoms of fish and a quantity of other with all and singular the before mentioned property and all the estate right title and interest of the said Amos Johnson and to the said granted or intended to be granted property to have and to hold the said hereby granted property with every part and parcel thereof unto the said Benjamin Griffin his heirs and assigns forever to the only proper use and behoof of him the said Benjamin Griffin his heirs and assigns forever and the said Amos Johnson has been Esquire administrator the affairs and property hereby conveyed unto the said Benjamin Griffin his heirs and assigns against all persons or who sever shall and will warrant and support either by their presents upon oath or otherwise that the said Benjamin Griffin his heirs and assigns and administrators shall permit the said Amos Johnson to remain in quiet and peaceable possession of the above and property hereby conveyed and take the perfect benefit to his and his heirs and assigns in the payment of the said sum of one hundred dollars and thus upon the condition that the said Benjamin Griffin his heirs and assigns shall and will as soon after the happening of such default of payment to or they may think proper or the said Allen Edwards his heirs and assigns or assigns shall request sell at Publick Auction the aforementioned property to the said Benjamin Griffin his heirs and assigns for the purpose and shall think proper sell to the highest bidder for ready money at Publick Auction after giving the lands plenty of sales at his own discretion and given ten days notice thereof at the Court house of the County aforesaid and at as many other places as he may think proper and out of the moneys arising from such sale shall after satisfying the charges thereof and all other expenses attending the premises pay to the said Allen Edwards his heirs and assigns the said sum of one hundred dollars with the interest which may have therein accrued and the balance of any pay to the said Amos Johnson his heirs and assigns but of the whole of the said sum of one hundred dollars shall be fully paid off and discharged to the said Allen Edwards his heirs and assigns on or before the 1<sup>st</sup> day of September 1824 so that no default of payment be made then the Indenture to be void or else to remain in full force and virtue in witness whereof the parties to these presents have hereunto set their hands and affixed their seals the day and year first within written
