This Indenture made this 25th of October in the year 1823 between Simon Musgrave and Lydia his wife of the first part and Fuldung S. Michoud of the second part witnesses that the said Simon Musgrave for and in consideration of the sum of twelve hundred dollars by the said Michoud to him the said Musgrave in hand paid hath given granted bargained and sold and by these presents doth give grant bargain and sell to the said Michoud a certain tract or parcel of land situated near the Town of Abbeville in the County of Southampton containing by estimation one hundred and one or less and bounded as follows to wit beginning at a lightwood post at the old end at the head of Catherine's Mill-Stream along the said Head South 15 East 600 paces to a Safford's Still shown across the said Head North 50 degrees East 2 1/2 paces to a lightwood stake by line of a line a corner of White Musgrave's lot and thence thence South 12 degrees East 55 1/2 paces to a Safford's Still standing on a detached house between the house of Mrs. Rogers White and premises there along the said Rogers line to the land of Melvin Allen thence along his said Allen line across the road to Job. Brown's corner at a Maple tree between said Allen Brown and the premises shown on map there along said Brown's line to the beginning to him and his heirs forever except a toll called Pillets containing one half acre the boundaries and description of which will be seen referred being had to a deed from L. W. Platt also one and a half acre consisting of three half acres lots belonging to Simon & Shaw as in a deed executed by Clement Nicholls and wife to them now on file in the Office of Southampton And the said Michoud warrants and defends the title to the said lands to him the said Michoud and his heirs against the Claim or Claims of himself and his heirs and against the lawful Claims of all others In testimony whereof the said Simon Musgrave and Lydia his wife have hereunto set their hands and seals this date above expressed of
