This Indenture made and entered into this 2nd day of March 1824 between
Thomas Sumner Camp and Richard Northington witnesses that obtained the said Northington
being written unto the said Sumner in the sum of \$125.00 by bond bearing date the 1st day of June 1822
and being desirous to secure the same to the said Sumner and his heirs, he on the 17th day of June 1822
by his deed conveyed all his right title and interest to and in the estate of Henry Briggs and his
heirs which he was entitled in right of John Corp to the said Camp in trust for the purposes of the said
deed, viz. that the said Camp on default of the said Northington and being required by the said Sumner
would repay the sum to said and out of the proceeds thereof first pay the said and charges then the debt due to
the said Sumner, and the balance pay to the said Northington, the said Camp fully acknowledging
that he does not and does not claim any right or interest on the said property, further than for the
purpose of executing the trust aforesaid and the said Northington having freely fully discharged
the debt aforesaid to the said Sumner in manner and form agreed to by the said obligation and
the said Sumner and the said Camp agreeing to confirm and assign to the said Northington
all their right to the said property as conveyed. For the said Sumner by then present in con-
sideration of the premises and under the full advice and consent that the said Northington had fully
satisfactorily discharged the said debt intended to be secured by the deed in trust on these premises
did and doth hereby release to the said Northington all interest which he hath or had to enjoy
by virtue of the said deed in trust hereby acknowledging himself satisfied and the said Northington
fully discharged and hereby authorizing the said Camp to grant full discharge and release as aforesaid to the
said Northington and the said Camp by their present recollection of the matters herein above
written of and for the further consideration of one dollar to him by the said Northington in
hand paid the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged and also being by the said Sumner assigned
shall give grant release and confirm unto the said Richard Northington and by then present
deed release and confirm unto them all right title and interest which to the said Camp did devise
to and in the said property in the said deed in trust above alluded to by virtue of the
same to him and his heirs forever. In testimony whereof the said Thomas Sumner and
the said Thomas Camp have hereunto set their hands and seals this day above.

This Indenture made and executed into this 25th day of September 1820 between Dr. Samuel Lewis of the
one part and Sprally Williams of another part and Lewis Fort of the third part all of the County of Southampton &
State of Virginia Witnesses that whereas the said Dr. Samuel Lewis is desirous to secure and save himself the said Lewis Fort as a part of
the said Lewis Fort to Robert Peckell as agent of Benjamin Lewis died for about the sum of one hundred
dollars or thereabouts as well more fully appears by the bond of the said Dr. Samuel Lewis and on the profession of the said Robert Peckell
in consideration of the premises a warrant for the further consideration of one dollar in hand paid to the said Dr. Samuel Lewis by the said Sprally
Williams and also before the executing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof the said Dr. Samuel Lewis hereby acknowledges that the said
Dr. Samuel Lewis hath granted Benjamin and sold unto the said Sprally Williams the following negro slaves to wit Thomas
Wright Peckell Sam and George & there and to his the said Lewis together with their issue to him the said
Sprally Williams his heirs and assigns for ever from the claim of the said Dr. Samuel Lewis and the said Dr. Samuel doth
further confirm and agree to warrant and defend the title of and to the said Lewis appears to have the said
Williams as agent the claim of herself and also the person forever. In witness whereof and also the
true intent and meaning of these presents that should the said Lewis Fort by reason of his said
Said Sprally appears to be compelled to pay the said bond or any part thereof that the said Sprally
Williams shall or being thereof required and required by the said Fort also having given
money says to him of the true and plain of these parts the said Lewis before Dr. Samuel Lewis
in witness to the highest bidder for cash or in money thereof as shall be most
