

This Indenture made and entered into this 2nd day of March 1824 between Thomas Camp and Richard Hemington witnesses that entered the said Hemington by or under the said Camp in the sum of \$125 by bond bearing date the 1st day of June 1822 and being desirous to secure the same to the said Sumner and his heirs, do on the 2nd day of June 1824 by this deed convey all his right title and interest to and in the estate of Henry Briggs and his heirs which he was entitled in right of John Briggs to the said Camp in trust for the purposes of the said security, so that the said Camp on default of the said Hemington and being required by the said Sumner would before the said Sumner and out of the proceeds thereof first pay the costs and charges then the debt due to the said Sumner and the balance pay to the said Hemington the said Camp fully acknowledging that he does not and does not claim any right or interest on the said property further than for the purpose of securing the trust aforesaid and the said Hemington having freely fully discharged the debt aforesaid to the said Sumner in manner and form agreeable to the said obligation and the said Sumner and the said Camp agreeing to confirm and assign to the said Hemington all their right to the said property as conveyer. For the said Sumner by their presents in consideration of the premises and sum of the full debt aforesaid given that the said Hemington had fully and faithfully discharged the said debt intended to be secured by the deed in trust on these presents and did to each and every Release to the said Hemington all interest which he hath or had to pay by virtue of the said deed in trust hereby acknowledging himself satisfied and the said Hemington fully discharged and hereby authorizing the said Camp to grant full discharge and release as trustee to the said Hemington and the said Camp by their presents in consideration of the matters herein above specified of and for the further consideration of one dollar to him by the said Hemington in hands paid the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged and also being by the said Sumner conveyed and confirmed unto the said Richard Hemington and by their presents doth Release and Confirm unto him all right title and interest which he the said Camp doth possess to and in the said property in the said deed in trust above intended to by virtue of the same to him and his heirs forever. This Indenture made and executed into this 25th day of September 1820 between Dr. Samuel Lewis of the one part and Spradley Williams of another part and Lewis Fort of the third part all of the County of Poughkeepsie witnesses that whereas the said Dr. Samuel Lewis is desirous to secure and save himself the said Lewis Fort as a security of the said Lewis Fort to Robert Rockwell as agent of Benjamin Lewis died for about the sum of one hundred dollars or thereabouts as well more fully appears by the bond of the said Dr. Samuel Lewis on the possession of the said Robert Rockwell in consideration of the premises and sum of the full debt aforesaid given that the said Dr. Samuel Lewis by the said Spradley Williams and before the aforesaid and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof the said Dr. Samuel Lewis doth hereby acknowledge and the said Spradley Williams the following negro Slave (last of those) called Dick, Sam and George & there and to his the said Lewis together with then necessary to him the said Spradley Williams his heirs and assigns free from the claim of the said Dr. Samuel Lewis and the said Dr. Samuel doth further confirm and agree to confirm and defend the title of and to the said Lewis as appears to him the said Williams as agent the claim of Henry and all other persons forever. In trust nevertheless and it is the true intent and meaning of these presents that should the said Lewis Fort by reason of his said Dr. Samuel's aforesaid be compelled to pay the said bond or any part thereof that the said Spradley Williams shall on being thereof required and requested by the said Fort also having given money says to him of the how and place of said sale the said Lewis before Rockwell and others named to the highest bidder for cash or so many thereof as shall be most to
