This Indenture made this fourteenth day of February one thousand eight hundred and twenty four Between William Alfred Drew of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the one part and Charles Drew of the said County and State of the other part Witnesseth that for and in consideration of the Sum of four hundred and twenty five dollars the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by the said William Alfred Drew hath granted bargained and by these presents do grant bargain and sell and confirm unto the said Charles Drew and his heirs forever one certain tract or parcel of Land situate two thirds of James Drews tract of Land containing One Hundred and thirty six acres or thereabouts more or less bounded as follows on the north by the Lands of the said William Alfred Drew on the west by the Lands of Mrs Lucy Adams on the south by George Stephenson on the east by Charles Harrison with all the improvements and things thereto belonging To have and to hold unto the said Charles Drew his heirs and assigns forever which Land I the said William Alfred Drew do warrant and forever defend the title of said Charles Drew and his heirs forever against the Claim of any person whatsoever In Witness whereof I the said William Alfred Drew have hereunto set my hand and seal this day and date above written

Barley of Staunton his wife of Virginia County in the State of Virginia of the one part and Edwin Dicks of Staunton County and the State aforesaid of the other part Witnesseth that the said Thomas M. Barley and his wife for and in consideration of the Sum of Two dollars of lawful money of Virginia to them the said Thomas M. Barley and his wife in hand well and truly paid the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged they the said Thomas M. Barley and his wife have granted bargained and sold and by these presents do grant bargain and sell unto the said Edwin Dicks his heirs and assigns a certain tract of Land lying in Southampton County containing about one acre or thereabouts more or less bounded as follows between the Land of Mrs Hamels and the said Thomas M.
