This Indenture made this 8th day of December in the year of our Lord eight hundred and twenty three between Silas Sumner as Commissioner appointed by the County Court of Southampton to make sale of the Lands whereof Jesse Hart of the said County and seized and possessed of of the first part and George Wrenn of the second part witnesses that the said Silas Sumner Commissioner do as aforesaid for and in consideration of the sum of Four hundred and one dollars to him in hand paid or secured to be paid before the entering of delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have bargained and sold and by these presents do bargain and sell unto the said George Wrenn his heirs and assigns forever an certain tract or parcel of Lands lying and being in the County of Southampton supposed to contain one hundred and twenty acres to the same more or less it being all that tract or parcel of Land owned by the aforesaid Jesse Hart late of the aforesaid County of Southampton and bounded by the Lands of Joseph Hart Hartwell Hart Abner Edward Bailey and others together with all and singular the appurtenances thereto belonging or in any way appertaining and the reversion and reversions Remainders and Remainders yearly and other rents issues and profits thereof and of every part and parcel thereof to have and to hold the said tract of Land with the tenement hereditaments and all and singular other the premises herein before mentioned or intended to be bargained and sold and every part and parcel thereof with every of their rights members and appurtenances unto the said George Wrenn his heirs and assigns forever and the said Silas Sumner Commissioner do as aforesaid for himself and his heirs the said Land with all and singular the premises and appurtenances before mentioned unto the said George Wrenn his heirs and assigns free from the claim or claims of him the said Silas Sumner and Commissioner to his heirs and of all and every person or persons whomsoever claiming by through or from him as Commissioner shall will and do warrant and forever defend by these presents In witness whereof the said Silas Sumner Commissioner do hath herunto set his hand and seal the day and year first above written
