hundred and twenty three between William L. Everett and Mariah A. his wife of the first and one Clement
Hobelle of the second part witness by the oath of Thomas J. Hobelle late of the County of Gloucester the said
Marie Hobelle having entited as one of the natural relations of the said Thomas to our last will and testament
of the said Thomas left said Thomas due debts and released him as now pending on the Chancery side of the
County Court of Gloucester a debt for the sale and division of the proceeds of sale of the real property aforesaid
to which said the said William L. and Maria Hobelle are parties and as he entited in the said prop-
erty is deceased the said Clement Hobelle his son and heir
and environment this Indenture therefore witnesseth that as well for and consideration of the sum of
as of the sum of four dollars to them in hand paid by the said Clement Hobelle the receipt whereof they
do hereby acknowledge they the said William L. Everett and Maria Hobelle his wife have bargained and sold
and do by these presents bargain and sell unto the said Clement Hobelle his heirs and executors all
right title and interest which may have devolved to the said Thomas A. by the death of Maria Hobelle
deed to the property aforesaid and they do hereby warrant and forever defend the title to the said against
troubles and all persons claiming by or through them upon trust and for the following purposes namely
that is to say that out of the price of said sale to be made either by order of the said County Court of Gloucester
or by the said Clement Hobelle of the said Court shall be used to defray the said Clement is to
pay first the expenses attending the making and recording this Indenture secondly to retain
the sum of One hundred and seven dollars and fifty cents the sum of from the said Everett
and lastly he is to use the surplus to purchase such property as the said Maria may need and other
money or convenience to the same so that she and her children may have the education and enjoyment
of the said and the said Clement Hobelle for himself and his Heirs and Executors with the said
William and Maria that he will on all respects well and faithfully execute the trust hereby imposed
whichever according to the true intent and meaning of their parents In testimony whereof the parties
