This Indenture made this ninth day of March one thousand eight hundred and four twenty four between
 between Septha Darden of Southampton County Virginia of the first part Jacob Darden likewise
 to Jacob and Seth Williams orphans of Southampton County of the second part Alfred Darden of
 the County and State aforesaid of the third part Witnesseth that he the said Septha Darden on order
 as appears by a certain Note under Seal executed by him the said Septha Darden to the said Jacob
 Darden likewise as aforesaid bearing date the twenty fourth day of January 1824 for the sum of
 seven thousand and seventy one dollars and 29 Cents payable on or before the first day of January 1825
 and for the further consideration of one dollar to him the said Septha Darden on hand paid by
 the said Alfred Darden at as before the executing and delivery of these presents to the said Septha
 Darden he has granted bargained sold alien and Conformed and to his present and lawful
 bargain sold alien and Conformed unto them the said Alfred Darden his heirs and assigns forever a
 certain tract or parcel of Land lying on a Spring in the County of Southampton aforesaid containing by
 estimation three hundred and thirty eight acres to the same more or less bounded by the lands of the said
 Jacob Darden on the north and south and east by black water river on the east and south east and by
 the river swamp by the west and south and not being the whole of the land and plantations whereon
 the said Septha Darden now lives and which he derived by deed of Gift from his father the said
 Jacob Darden which said deed of Gift is duly recorded in the Clerk's Office of the County Court of South-
 ampton aforesaid To have and to hold the said bargained premises with all and singular the premises
 profits and emoluments thereto belonging unto him or out of the same in any manner springing or
 proceeding to him the said Alfred Darden and to his heirs and assigns forever or upon the sole coven-
 ant that is to say that if the said Septha Darden his Executors or administrators not on or before the
 first day of January next ensuing the date of these presents fully pay and discharge the aforesaid debt of
 seven thousand and seventy one dollars and 29 Cents that then it shall be the duty of him the said Alfred Darden
 as soon as he shall be thereto required by him the said Jacob Darden his Executors or assigns and having
 first advertised in due form the time and place of sale to be held up and sell the block of Land aforesaid
 to the highest bidder for ready money and out of the money so raised to pay first the expenses incident
 to this present purchase and then the debt aforesaid with its growing interest or so much thereof as shall be
 then be due and unpaid and the surplus of any in his hands shall remain to be paid by him to him
 the said Septha Darden or to his heirs or assigns in testimony whereof they the said Jacob Septha Darden
 Jacob Darden and Alfred Darden have here set their hands and seals the day and date first before

 bargained and sold and by these presents do give grant bargain and sell unto the said William L
 DeBelle a certain plantation tract and parcel of land which is purchased of the said William L
 DeBelle by estimation two hundred and five acres be the same more or less aforesaid to
 the aforesaid and the Townships under fully appear which is bounded by the lands of
 James Nathaniel Danville White Henry James Cobbs Nicholas Williams Jr and the
 aforesaid Joseph Swamp To have and to hold the aforesaid Land with all and
