This Indenture, made and entered into the 9th day of January in the year of Lord 1824 between James Tillar and Sally B. Tillar his wife of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the one part and James Wright of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the other part doth witness that the said James B. Tillar and Sally Tillar hath for and in consideration of the sum of Five hundred and thirty three and one third parts dollars to us in hand paid the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged hath bargained sold and delivered unto the said James Wright one certain tract or piece of Land lying and being in the aforesaid County of Southampton in the long runnels thereof at being part of the tract of Land devised to the said James Tillar by his Grandfather the Major Tillar dec'd and generally called and known by the Name of Containing by late Survey together near more or less and bounded as follows that is to say Beginning at a stake oak a Corner of said James Wright along his line of 87 1/2 87 1/2 pole to a pine E 38 1/2 87 pole to a pine S 77 1/2 W 1/2 pole to a sweet gum S 27 W 1/2 pole to a white oak a corner to the tract of Capt. Tillamons S 1/2 then a run Choppes line S 1/2 W 39 1/2 pole to the Beginning So here and to here the said tract of Land and premises with appurtenances right interest and profit in any wise belonging thereto on a sure estate of inheritance unless Simple and then the said James and Sally B. Tillar do for ourselves our heirs and assigns forever warrant defend against force against the claim or claims of any persons whatsoever.
