This Indenture made this fourth day of January in the year eighteen hundred and twenty four between  
Benjamin Gray of Southampton County and State of Virginia of the one part and George Gray of the  
said County of the other part Witnesseth that the said Benjamin Gray being party and entitled  
to the said County of Southampton County in the sum of three hundred and twenty five dollars & five  
Cents full money of Virginia and by and with lawful intent from this date and hereafter  
and decisions to secure the payment of the said sum to the said Thomas Gray in consideration  
of and for the love and favor of him in consideration of the sum of the said dollars paid the receipt  
of a duly acknowledged the said Benjamin Gray hath given goodly charge and sold and  
has been present and given grant bargain and sell and make over unto the said George Gray his  
heir and assigns the following property to wit one tract of land containing one hundred and fifty acres more  
or less bounded by the lands of Thomas Applegate's Embury Pappas and Andrew Pappas  
as appears to the Surveyors plot and more than the distance of one mile to the said  
said and possessors to wit the said George Gray for the express purpose of paying the said  
sum of three hundred and twenty five dollars of lawful money of Virginia on or the  
said Benjamin Gray should make default where it is hereby agreed & declared to be the  
true intent and meaning of this indenture that if the said sum as above specified be not paid  
unto the said Thomas Gray with all interest thereon before the 25<sup>th</sup> December 1824 then  
the said Thomas Gray shall be at full liberty thereafter to whom he may see fit to  
said debt or any part thereof (the said Benjamin Gray) impied to require and compel the said  
George Gray to take unto his property on the said land and after as well as during the term
