This Indenture made this fourth day of January in the year eighteen hundred and twenty four between
Benjamin Gray of Southampton County and State of Virginia of the one part and George Gray of the
said County of the other part Witnesseth that the said Benjamin Gray being duly informed that
the said George Gray of Southampton County in the sum of Three hundred and twenty five dollars & 50
cents lawful money of Virginia and by hand with lawful interest from this date and Consenting
and desirous to secure the payment of the said sum to the said Thomas Gray in consideration
of the said George Gray's and Thomas Gray's and in consideration of the sum of the dollars in hand paid the receipt
of the said George Gray acknowledges the said Benjamin Gray hath given graciously conveyed and sold and
has then presents do hereby grant bargain and sell and make over unto the said George Gray his
heirs and assigns the following property to wit one tract of land containing one hundred and fifty acres more
or less situate upon the lands of Thomas Applegate's Ambrose Tappan and Charles (Bridges)
as reference to the Surveyors plot will more than the distance Course of the said land and to wit the said
land and premises unto the said George Gray for the express purpose of paying the said
sum of Three hundred and twenty five dollars of the said Benjamin Gray's and the said George Gray
the said Benjamin Gray should and he is hereby agreed & declared to be the
true intent and meaning of this Indenture that if the said sum as above specified be not paid
unto the said Thomas Gray with all interest then on before the 25 December 1824 then
the said Thomas Gray shall be at full liberty thereafter to have as many such lands the
said debt or any part thereof (to be taken) unpaid to require and compel the said
George Gray to take unto his property from the said land and after as is lawfully the time
