Witnessed by a Decretal order made by Boultonpton County Court at the December Term in the year eighteen hundred and twenty one in Chancery between Robert Godfrey and Abigail R. his wife late Margaret R.
 their pleniffy and Henry D. Blom son of Henry Blom deceased and Benjamin Blom & his surviving accommodation
 which will amount of the sum of Twenty Pounds and Ten Shillings and Benjamin Blom & his surviving accommodation
 of said Henry Blom decd the said James Henry and Robert by their male friend John Thomas and the said
 Samuel by James Godfrey his next friend deponent among other things of value under seal Benjamin
 Blom Jr. should sell the Lands lying on the South side of the said River Blom was sign'd
 and a witness. First Male there attached on a Credit of one hundred and five years remanente to Robert Blom of
 the town and place being first given and that the proceeds of the same to be divided into four equal parts and to be
 by Compt each good security and to distribute as follows namely and whence the said Benjamin Blom
 p. hach according to direction of the said decreed order to the said Robert Godfrey the said Robert
 Godfrey because he purchased at the rate of Seven dollars and twenty five cents per acre and whereas the
 land aforesaid has been Surveyed and found to contain Seven hundred and forty one acres and
 whereas the said Benjamin Blom p. h. was by the said decreed order directed to make a conveyance in fee
 simple to the purchaser of the said tract of Land. After this Indenture heparteth made between the said
 Benjamin Blom of the first part and the said Robert Godfrey of the second part both of the County of Southampton
 on the ninth day of February in the year of our Lord Christ one thousand eight hundred and twenty four witnesseth
 that the said Benjamin Blom p. h. for his full and entire direction of the premises and for and in consideration of the sum of
 the sum of Two thousand two hundred and twenty two dollars and twenty five cents to be paid by him
 as aforesaid in the foregoing sum as herein before specified amounts by the said Robert Godfrey had long ago
 sold alien & sepphied and confirmed and by these presents doth bargain sell alien sepphied and confirm
 unto the said Robert Godfrey his heirs and assigns forever the before mentioned tract of Land of
 containing Seven hundred and twenty one acres and bounded by the same boundaries as written below
 to the said Henry Blom in his life time and the testator first made these articles to have and to hold the said
 tract of Land and conten. First male shall attach regular with all the profits Conveniences advantages
 common & curiosities and all other appurtenances therunto belonging or in any wise appertaining to the said
 Robert Godfrey his heirs and assigns forever to the only proper use and benefit of him the said Robert
 Godfrey his heirs and assigns and the said Benjamin Blom p. h. doth hereby command and agree with the
 said Robert Godfrey his heirs and assigns for himself his heirs executors and administrators defend
 the right and title in and to the said Land and settle against the Claims or demands of all and every persons
 whatsoever claiming in or through and under him and against no other person and it is hereby distinctly agreed
 and understood by and between the said Benjamin Blom p. h. and the said Robert Godfrey that to the
 said Benjamin Blom p. h. doth hereby belong to the said Robert Godfrey no more either greater or less
 title to the aforesaid Land and estate than he the said Benjamin Blom p. h. hath power to enjoy
 by virtue of the decreed order referred to. In witness whereof the said Benjamin Blom p. h. hath countersigned
