This Indenture made and entered into this 15 day of May 1826 Between Jeph. Tarter of the first part Henry Parsons of the same part and John Parsons of the third part all of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia Whereas the said John Parsons by his deede doth shew that he doth admit to record in the Clerk's office the County Court of Southampton on the 17 day of January 1826 in order to secure the payment of the sum of three hundred and fifty pounds of lawful money to him the said John Parsons to the said Henry Parsons and to the said Jeph. Tarter a certain negro slaves as follows a negro man named Sam and a woman named Bethe and their children to wit Aaron Amy and Aaron and the sum of

Whereby then fully paid by the said Jeph. Tarter to the said Henry Parsons the said Henry Parsons and Jeph. Tarter both requested the estate conveyed by the said Jeph. Tarter to the said Henry Parsons be now released to have the said John Parsons

This Indenture therefore witnesseth that for and in consideration of the premises and the sum of the consideration of one dollar by the said John Parsons to the said Jeph. Tarter in hand paid before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by the said Jeph. Tarter with the consent of the said Henry Parsons signified by his being party thereto have granted bargained remised released and forgiven quit Claim and by these presents do fully and absolutely grant remised released and forgiven quit Claim unto the said John Parsons his heirs and assigns forever all the estate right title interest claim and demand wheresoever he has or may have in and to the said John Parsons and to the said negro slaves to have and to hold the said negro slaves to the said John Parsons his heirs and assigns to the only proper use and behoof of the said John Parsons his heirs and assigns forever so that the said Jeph. Tarter and Henry Parsons their heirs and assigns in any other person whatsoever claiming under him shall by any way or means hereafter have claim challenge or demand any estate right title or interest of or to the said negro slaves in any part or parcel thereof but from all and every action for the recovery thereof and from all and every estate right title interest or demand of or to the said slaves in any part thereof they and every of them shall be utterly excluded and barred forever by these presents

This Indenture made and entered into this 26<sup>th</sup> day of May 1824 Between William E. Daugherty of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the first part Daniel D. Jones of the County of Prince George and State of Virginia of the second part and James B. Colt of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the third part Whereas the said William E. Daugherty stands justly indebted unto the said Daniel D. Jones in the sum of three hundred and twenty five dollars and eighty cents on right of the said late estate of Daugherty Fourteen hundred Dollars and more cents as Guardian to Mary A. Daugherty as well appear by the Quardian account returned to his Honor Court of about four hundred and the first of August 1818 and the sum of three hundred and thirty nine dollars and eighty cents on right of two wife of said and a balance of two hundred and two dollars and seventy five cents as Guardian to Mary A. Daugherty as well appear by the account of the said J. B. Colt of the said Daugherty and more of record in the Register's office of the County of Bedford N.C. and the sum of one hundred and six dollars and twenty five cents on right of two wife of said as well appear by the manuscript of the services of the negroes belonging to the estate of Richard Daugherty and more for the further consideration of an dollar now hand paid to the said William E. Daugherty by the said James B. Colt before the recording of these presents
