This Inventory made this 25th day of February in the year of our Lord Christ One thousand eight hundred
and twenty four between Thomas Dawson and Elizabeth Dawson wife of the County of Southampton and Parish of Great Stoke of the one part
and Jacob Jordan of the same County and Parish of the other had witnesseth that the said Thomas Dawson and Elizabeth his wife for and in consideration
one of the sum of three hundred and ten pounds to him paid by the said Jacob Jordan to receipt whereof the said Thomas Dawson &
Elizabeth his wife doth acknowledge themselves fully and truly satisfied and paid shall grant and release unto the said Jacob Jordan
and his heirs and assigns and sell unto the said Jacob Jordan to him and to his heirs forever on certain land or parcel of
Land and premises situated lying in the County and Parish of which are bounded as follows to wit beginning at a Pine
standing in a branch called the Hopyen Branch where the said land begins equal to the width of William Cook's house 12 ft. "old
gate railings on the line of the 40 rods road there due south so said road running in the same line from 12 ft. E. 27 ft. far to a tree two
standing in a small hollow there N. W. E. 2 ft. to the first post marking only the head of the bay and branch thereof down
the bay few rods to 2 ft. E. 24 ft. belted to a pine standing in the body bay branch a narrow narrow between Jacob Jordan
and Thomas Dawson agreed to be Conformable made between Jacob Jordan and Thomas Dawson who are to be continuing
parties thence due north by line to the head of a small branch which has made the line between the two Culmend branches
and which was bounded by the parties aforesaid thence from the said head of said branch the same continuing to the
branch called the Hopyen Branch thence up the Hopyen branch of 2 ft. 10 1/2 ft. far to the first station. Together
with all houses and other Edifices buildings yards gardens orchards, way, water and water courses and fences belonging
or in any wise appertaining to the said tract or parcel of Land and premises to have and to hold the
same unto the said Jacob Jordan to him and to his heirs forever and the said Thomas Dawson and Elizabeth his
wife for and in consideration of the sum of £100.00 paid to the said Jacob Jordan by the said Thomas Dawson and Elizabeth his wife
