County of Southampton of the first part) Plaintiff Calvert of the County of Southampton & heir of the second part
and Master Calvert of the County of Southampton of the third part witnesseth that whereas the said Richard
Master Calvert is greatly indebted to the said Samuel Calvert on the sum of three hundred dollars due by simple interest
from 21/12th bearing date with their presents and being willing and desirous to secure the said Calvert and for the further consideration
of one dollar to him in hand paid by the said Master before the receipt whereof of the said Richard Buck with
fully acknowledging both granted bargained and sold and by these presents did grant bargained and sold unto the said
Master Calvert a certain tract or parcel of Land lying and being in the County of Southampton and bounded as will
fully appear by a Deed recorded by Joseph Nick and wife to Samuel Calvert Jr. doth of the County of Southampton
and of Record in the Clerk's office of said County containing forty five acres to have and to hold the said tract or
parcel of Land with all and singular the appurtenances thereto belonging or in any way appertaining to him the said Richard Calvert
his heirs and assigns forever notwithstanding upon this Special trust and Condition that the said Master Calvert in these
Ears or a year may and shall at any time at the request of the said Samuel Calvert his heirs or executors make sale
of the aforesaid Land for such aforesaid giving ten days previous notice of the time and place of sale and with the proceeds
arising from such sale first pay and satisfy the aforesaid sum of three hundred dollars due from the
said Richard Buck to the said Samuel Calvert by simple interest as aforesaid with the legal interest
which may have accrued thereon and the surplus of any after having so payed the aforesaid pay over to the said
Richard Buck his heirs heirs and the said Richard Buck for himself his heirs and executors
