This Indenture made the 25th day of February 1826, between Lewis Worrell of the County of Southampton and Lewis Worrell of the same County witnesseth that for and consideration of the sum of one dollar in hand paid by the said Lewis Worrell the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by the said Lewis Worrell to make for the further Consideration of the ten and oftentwelve shillings per acre for the said Tilly Roberton have granted, bargained and sold and by these presents have granted bargained and sold unto Lewis Worrell in trust for the benefit of my said wife Tilly Clark Roberton during the continuance of her and her husband Henry Roberton the lands and manor of Land ornall the house which was allotted to her by my father or which she now has in long the interest which the said Lewis Worrell purchased of the said Tilly Roberton and her husband Henry Roberton man of freehold in the County Court of Southampton also two feather beds and furnished one bed and give one spinning wheel and Cards one Iron pot and kettle one dasher one muller four setting chairs one table one chest one candle stick 10 dozen candle sticks dozen towels and bedkyn one iron and seven bags and the same and what more in the house and the said Lewis Worrell for value of his house况ent and aduances above mentioned and agrees to and will sell the said Lewis Worrell to the said Tilly Roberton as to her in the said house and enjoy all the benefits arising from the use and of land for the maintenance of the parties to these presents here blemis set and afford them boards and stads the day and year first above written signed sealed and delivered

This Indenture made this 1st day of April in the year of our Lord Christ 1826 Between Robert Nelson of the first part Benjamin Griffin of the second part and Willis Nelson of the third part all of the County of Southampton parishes of portsmouth and city of virginia witnesseth the said Willis Nelson has given him paid and promises on a debt of two thousand two hundred pounds that Robert Nelson did sign and sayd of for the sum of five hundred and two dollars and has given several bonds payable to different persons with the said Willis Nelson his security to the same which will more fully appear when the said Willis Nelson is willing and desires to indemnify and secure the said Willis Nelson should default to make on the payment of any or either of the said bonds which the said Willis Nelson in the County to whom this Indenture aforesaid had for and consideration of the sum of one dollar to the said Willis Nelson and for the further Consideration of the sum of one dollar to the said Willis Nelson on hand paid the said Benjamin Griffin the trustee at or before the dateing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by the said Willis Nelson having given granted bargained sold aliened enfeoffed released and confirmed and by these presents doth give grant bargain and sell release and confirm unto the said Benjamin Griffin his heirs and assigns forever all the tract or parcel of Land lying and bordering the County aforesaid that Robert Nelson did sign Containing one hundred and more or less and bounded on the west by the Lands of Henry Sonnen or the west by the lands of Thomas Hutton or the north and east by corner hills being last well more fully appear with all and singular the appurtenances to the said Land belonging or in any way appertaining to the same or part thereof to have and to hold the said Land granted unto a parcel of Land and premises unto the said Benjamin Griffin his heirs and assigns forever to the only proper use and behely of whom the said Benjamin Griffin his said Executors executors and assigns forever remainder and term following that is to say that the said Robert Nelson his heirs Executors and assigns forever remain in quiet possession of the said Land and Land given before mentioned and lastly the possessors thereof to his own uses until he default the same of any or either of the bonds given to the signature of Robert Nelson which were given for the sale of the said Land he did sign and purposed of estuary which is in part and therupon this further trust that from the said Benjamin Griffin his heirs executors and assigns shall permit the said Robert Nelson to remain in quiet possession of the said Land given before mentioned and lastly the possessors thereof to his own uses until he default the same of any or either of the bonds given to the signature of Robert Nelson which were given for the sale of the said Land he did sign and purposed of estuary which is in part and therupon this further trust that from the said Benjamin Griffin his heirs executors and assigns
