

This Indenture made this 15th day of August 1834 between William Mafpsenburg of the
 first part James Robelle of the second part and James D Mafpsenburg Henry Curly
 and of the third part Whereas the said William Mafpsenburg owing to the former
 note to Charles M. Goodwyn for one hundred and seven dollars (so near cash seem)
 with James D Mafpsenburg security and is indebted to Henry Curly on the sum of
 and to Pollyann Mafpsenburg on the
 sum of
 for the payment of the same and the said William Mafpsenburg being desirous of securing
 the payment of said debts and indemnifying his said security That on this condition
 witnesseth that for and in consideration of the premises and also for the further said notes of
 Dollars of San Francisco money of Arizona to the said William Mafpsenburg he hath granted
 bargained and sold released and confirmed unto the said James Robelle his heirs and assigns
 the following property to wit One Bay Horse one Single English Horned Horned
 with the value of the Medicine and other Books Medicines of all sorts and Shop furniture with
 all the contents he has appointed unto his property of the said
 said James Robelle shall possess from the said William Mafpsenburg to him and enjoy the use of the same
 of the same until such time as it may be necessary to make sale of the same for the payment
 of the above debts and then upon this further Trust That the said James Robelle shall sell
 said property at such time and place and upon such terms as may seem best for the parties hereto
 having given reasonable public notice of the same and after satisfying incidental expenses shall pay
 said debt of the sales be sufficient and if such provision shall remain then he may discharge the
 same to be paid over to the said William Mafpsenburg In witness whereof the parties hereto
 at San Francisco and date this 15th August 1834

by William Hays, Esq. James Redden and James Thompson, the parties hereto and admitted to read,
and at a Court held for the aforesaid County of Southampton on the 16th August, 1824. The Indenture
as aforesaid was entered upon the proceedings of the day.

This Indenture made and entered into this 25th day of June 1822 between William (Mafsenburg) of the first part
 and James Rochelle of the second part and George Mafsenburg of the third part, Whereas the said William Mafsenburg
 is justly indebted unto the said James D Mafsenburg in the sum of three hundred and ninety seven
 Dollars and by note bearing date the 26th February 1822 and whereas the said James D Mafsenburg
 is desirous to be secured by the said William Mafsenburg for the payment of two hundred and ninety seven dollars
 and by promissory note to Robert Goodwyn and the said William Mafsenburg being desirous of
 securing the payment of the above debt and indemnifying the said James D Mafsenburg against any loss
 by reason of said suretyship Now This Indenture witnesseth that for and in consideration of
 the premises and the better consideration of our duties and duties of Magistrate to the said William
 Mafsenburg on hand part by the said James Rochelle to the said William Mafsenburg hath given
 granted, bargained and sold unto the said James Rochelle his heirs and assigns forever all of his right title and interest in and to
 the property now held by Robert Mafsenburg under the will of William (Mafsenburg) deceased a living
 his legal right portion of the do and to wit the same land as per also copy of the indenture
 which the said William Mafsenburg may have in the deed and in which the said Robert Mafsenburg
 reduced to possession To have and to hold the said hereby granted property unto the said
 said James Rochelle his heirs executors administrators and assigns forever that notwithstanding
 that the said James Rochelle or at such times as he may be required the said
 William Mafsenburg interests in the said property subject to distribution at the death of
 the aforesaid Robert Mafsenburg to the highest bidder at public auction for
 cash having fixed such times and places of sale as the court should require and
