This Indenture made this 5<sup>th</sup> day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty four between James Weston of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the one part, John Weston of the County and State aforesaid of the second part and Edward Henry Abbott of the same and aforesaid County and State aforesaid of the third part witnesseth Whereas the said James Weston is indebted to the said John Weston in the sum of two hundred and sixteen dollars which he is desirous to pay unto him whom the said Indenture witnesseth that he said James Weston for and in consideration of the sum of four dollars to him a friend paid by the said Henry Abbott he accepts whereof doth hereby acknowledge full payment sole and delivered and by these presents doth bargain sell and deliver unto the said Henry Abbott his sum and aforesaid certain tract or parcels of Land lying and being on the County and State aforesaid one of which tract is bounded as follows to wit beginning at a corner given me by the said Francis Lewis sometime to the performance first near the ditch which is the dividing line between the said land and the lands of John Westcott lies thence along the said ditch to a big tree in a French fence down the said fence to an oak tree known hence down to a water oak on the bank of the Great Swamp thence down the bank of the swamp to a small creek in which Francis Lewis fence along the said Francis line to a white oak the boundary formerly belonging to the said Westcott and the other tract of land is bounded as follows to wit adjoining the lands of Thomas James Edmund Downing goeth containing in both tracts forty two acres of land to the same more or less to have and to hold the said tract of land with all and singular the appurtenances and the said James Weston doth himself his heirs executors &c and make over to the said Henry Abbott his heirs and assigns the said tract of land and forever warrant and defend against and notwithstanding that the said Henry Abbott at any time after the 15<sup>th</sup> day of May Amdm' 1837 when the said John Weston aforesaid on his premises shall require the same or as the case may be which shall first take place or as the case Henry Abbott may think proper shall first take place shall forthwith pay to the said John Weston the sum of one hundred dollars for ready money after giving ten days publick notice by advertising the same and out of the money arising from such sale delivery and pay unto the said John Weston the aforesaid sum with the full interest as good taken at the rate of six per cent per annum with the costs of drawing and rendering of this Indenture and the expenses of any to be paid by the said Henry Abbott to him and the said James Weston his heirs &c on his order On witness whereof the said James Weston John Monnake and Henry Abbott have hereunto set their hands and sealed this day of
