This Indenture made this 5th day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty four between James Shenton of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the one part John Morra of the County and State aforesaid of the second part and Henry Shenton of the County and State aforesaid of the third part Witnesseth that whereas the said James Shenton is indebted to John Morra in the first sum of two hundred and sixteen dollars which he is desirous to pay unto John Morra and Henry Shenton for the said John Morra the receipt whereof he doth hereby acknowledge he hath bargained sold and delivered and by these presents do bargain sell and deliver unto the said Henry Shenton (more he has and assigned certain tracts or parcels of Land lying and being on the County and State aforesaid one of which tracts is bounded as follows to wit beginning at a Crown pine in William Francis Lewis plantation to the top of a tree near the ditch which is the dividing line between the said Land and the Lands of John Northwell do then thence along the said ditch to a Spring tree in a Peach Grove down the said Land to a Dutch Run thence down to a water oak on the corner of the said Dutch Run thence down the corner of the said Dutch Run to a Dutch Run in William Francis Lewis thence along the said Dutch Run to a water oak the same which formerly belonged to John Northwell do then the other tract of Land is bounded as follows to wit beginning the Lands of Thomas James Edmund Doory thence containing on both tracts nearly two acres of land to the same more or less To have and to hold the said said tracts of Land with all and singular the appurtenances and the said James Shenton do guarantee his heirs executors of Credit and make over to the said Henry Shenton and assigns the said tracts of Land and Groves convenient and defend against and warranteth that the said Henry Shenton at any time after the 1st day of May Annedominic 1831 when the said John Morra aforesaid or his heirs or assigns shall request the same or as the case may be shall first take place or as the said Henry Shenton may think proper shall first take place to sell for the best price that can be obtained to the English bidder for ready money after giving bond and security to be advertised by advertisement the same and out of the money arising from such sale shall pay and pay unto the said John Morra the aforesaid sum and satisfy the said as found taken at the time of executing this indenture together with the cost of procuring and recording of this Indenture and the receipt of any to be paid by the said Henry Shenton unto the said James Shenton his heirs or assigns On Witnessing of the said James Shenton John Morra and Henry Shenton have hereunto set their hands and seals this day of July
