This Indenture made this 19<sup>th</sup> day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty four between John S. White of the County of Southampton of the first part William Soper and Septa Lankford of the County of Southampton of the second part and Samuel Stanton and Martha his wife of the County last aforesaid of the third part all of the State of Virginia witnesseth the said John S. White and Martha his wife by their deed dated the 27<sup>th</sup> day of August 1823 and acknowledged in the Court of Southampton County on the 18<sup>th</sup> day of September in the year last aforesaid in consideration of the payment at the time herein specified of the sum of five hundred and <sup>Eighty</sup> seven dollars and Environs given unto my Son the said Samuel Stanton to the said Soper and Lankford Conveyed in Trust to the said John S. White a certain tract of Land lying and being in the County of Southampton aforesaid and bounded by the lines of Joseph N. Edwards Estate Nancy Wilson Miles Griffin Joseph Marquitt Amos Colman Wilson E. Daugherty Jacobin Turner William Soper and Sam Powers and the said sum of five hundred and eighty seven dollars and Seventy seven cents having been fully paid to the said Soper and Lankford by the said Samuel Stanton This Indenture therefore witnesseth the full and unconditional release of the premises aforesaid and also for an acknowledgment founded by the said Samuel Stanton to the said Soper and Lankford in hand paid before the making of delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged to the said John S. White with the consent of the said William Soper and Septa Lankford signified by their becoming a party hereto have granted released and forever quit claim and by these presents doth and absolutely grant remise release and forever quit claim unto the said Samuel Stanton his heirs and assigns forever all the Estate right title interest property claim and demand whatever in Law or equity of them ever had or had in the said John S. White William Soper and Septa Lankford of and to the aforesaid tract or parcel of Land with the appurtenances therunto belonging to have and to hold the aforesaid tract of Land ~~to~~ to appurtenance to the said Samuel Stanton his heirs and assigns forever & that the said John S. White Soper and Lankford nor either of them nor either of their heirs nor any other person whatsoever claiming under them or either of them shall by any ways or means hereafter have claim challenge or demand any estate right title or interest of any or to the said premises or any part or parcel thereof but from and ever after for the recovery thereof and from all and every estate right title interest or demand of any or to the said premises or any part or parcel thereof they and every of them shall be utterly exonerated and discharged from and by these presents In witness whereof the parties before first and second parts of these presents have hereunto set their hands and affixed their seals this day and Year first herein written signed sealed and acknowledge upon this day.
