Thomas Gray of John Morris Containing by estimation one hundred acres to the same more or less and bounded as is described
in a Deed from the said Morris to the said Gray wherein that had all its more fully of place and another part or parcel
of Land purchased by the said Gray from William Morris (Junior) adjoining the former parcel purchased of John
Morris and bounded as is described in a Deed from the said Williams to the said Gray wherein both parts had
all more fully appear Containing fifty acres to the same more or less Comprehending as a present interest of the
parcel bought from said John Morris and from said William Morris junior now deceased and fully owned by the
same more or less Slave and to hold to the said Benjamin Williams sonne and the said Thomas Gray and his
heirs for themselves their heirs Executors and administrators the said Benjamin previous to the said Benjamin Williams
and the slaves & goods against the Plaintiff's claim of action any just or personal due State and will by these presents
leave vacant and defend In Testimony whereof the said Thomas Gray and his wife have hereunto set
their hands and affixed their seals the day of One thousand eight hundred and ten written

This Indenture made this 19th day of July in the year Eighteen hundred and thirty four between Thomas Whitie of the
County of Southampton of the first part and Iyle Bankford of the said County of the second part and each of them of the County of
Southampton and all of the State of Virginia of the third part Whereas the said Thomas Whitie is jointly indebted to the said Iyle Bankford
in the sum of two hundred and fifteen dollars forty six Cents to be paid on the tenth day of August 1814 as by an note bearing date the 12th day
of July 1814 now fully appears which debt with legal interest thereon according to the said Thomas Whitie is willing and to have

Show this Indenture witnesseth that for and in consideration of the premises and also for the further Consideration of one
Dollar of lawful money of said State of Virginia to the said Thomas Whitie as same paid by the said Iyle Bankford
when before the sealing and delivery of these presents to the receipt whereof is hereinafter annexed to the said Thomas Whitie
both parties granted bargained sold released and confirmed to the said Iyle Bankford his heirs and assigns forever the
mugres Sam and Randall being in the County of Southampton in the State of Virginia and all the Estate right title interest
of the said Thomas Whitie or and to the said grants or intended to be hereby granted the aforesaid slaves hereby conveyed
into the said Iyle Bankford his heirs Estate and assigns forever to his only proper use and behoof of the said Iyle
Bankford his heirs Executors Administrators and assigns forever and the said Thomas Whitie for himself his heirs and
and assigns freely Conveyed promises and agreed to and with the said Iyle Bankford his heirs Estate and assigns
forever in manner and form following that is to say that the said Thomas Whitie his Executors and Administrators
hereby Conveyed unto the said Iyle Bankford his heirs Estate and assigns against all persons whatsoever shall
and will warrant and forever defend by their presents upon Trust notwithstanding that the said Iyle Bankford for his heirs
Estate and assigns herein called the said Thomas Whitie to remain in quiet and peaceable possession of the said Slaves
Sam and Randall property freely Conveyed and to the profit thereof to his own use until default be made in the payment
of the said sum of Two hundred and fifteen dollars forty six Cents in the whole or part and then upon this further trust
that he or the survivor of him or them his Estate and assigns of such survivors shall and will so soon after the happening
of such default of payment as they or either of them or his heirs Estate and assigns of such survivors may then be proper
or the said Iyle Bankford his heirs Estate and assigns shall require to sell the said Slave Sam and Randall freely
Conveyed or such part of them as the Trustee or his Representatives freely Conveyed to any Slave that shall be sufficient for the
purposes and shall think proper to sell to the highest bidder for ready money at Publick Auction after having given
so much time and place of sale at their own discretion and given ten days notice thereof and by advertisement to be set up
at the door of the Court House of Southampton County on some business day previous to the day of sale and out of the income
arising from such sale shall after satisfying the charges thereof and all other expenses attending the payment pay to the said
Trustee or his Executors and assigns the said sum of Two hundred and fifteen dollars forty six Cents with the
interest which may lawfully have accrued and the balance if any shall pay to the said Thomas Whitie to
his heirs Estate and assigns but of the whole of the said sum of Two hundred and fifteen dollars forty six cents
