And of the same debt by these presents acquit the said Henry Brown from the said Miles Taffor and Elizabeth his wife. It is granted bargained and sold above mentioned and by these presents to do grant, bargain and sell above mentioned and confirmed and by these presents to grant, bargain and sell above mentioned and confirmed unto the said Henry Brown our custom tract plantation and parcel of Land Containing by estimation one hundred and thirty acres being the same more or less being situated in the County of Southampton situated on the north side of the Shippishaw Branch and on the road leading from Jerusalem to Smithfield adjoining and bounded by the lands of George Lewis Peter Taffor and John Taffor being all the interest of the land described to me in my Testate last will and Testament and containing the whole being together on any part thereof belonging in any way appertaining with the reservation and reversion remainder and communalty rents yearly profits thereof and every part and parcel thereof to have and to hold the said foregoing premises with the appurtenances unto the said Henry Brown his heirs and assigns forever and the said Miles Taffor and Martha his wife for whom these these less than two years about the said bargained premises and every part and parcel thereof and all their appurtenances clear and exempt and delivered from all claims or other incumbrances whatsoever unto the said Henry Brown his heirs and assigns and all and every person or persons whatsoever does shall and will by these presents forever warrant
