 person, his and said and having the due legal policy explained to her. She then said Francis Marks acknowledged he
 same to be her act and deed and declared that she had willingly agreed said and did use the same and that she was
 not to retract if Green under oath and said date this 12 day of September 1822

On the Clerk's office the 14th July 1854 This Indenture was acknowledged by Benjamin Meade and together with a Certificate from Andrew Calverley, the acknowledgment and privings in name of Francis attached wife of the said Benjamin Meade she further heretofore and admits it to occur and s.d. Court held for the present County of Gloucestershire on the 14th August 1854 This Indenture and Certificate as aforesaid were ordered upon to be made good of the day.

 and twenty four dollars and thirty eight (one half) money of Virginia and due by bond executed this day with lawful
 interest and all paid and being willing and desirous to secure the payment of the said sum to the said John Williams
 in consideration whereof and in view of and in consideration of the sum of one dollar in hand paid the said John
 is hereby fully acknowledged the said John Rivers hath given granted bargained and sold and by these presents
 doth give grant bargain and sell and make over unto the said Col John Williams one horse and one pair of
 horses the following property to wit one negro by name Caesar one ditto named Ned one negro mare named Fanny one
 mule head of horses four cows twenty nine head of hogs three head of cows and furniture Eighteen?
