multiplication of his knowledge has bargained and sold and do for and give grant bargain and sell to the said Edward Francis his wife the
part of land lying in the County of Botetourt by retention on twenty two acres be the same more or less and adjoining the lands of
Thomas James Edward Francis and others the right and title of which we the said Benjamin Markes and wife do for and give
grant and release our heirs Executors the same and defend to the said Edward Francis his wife and assigns forever
whereof the said Francis hath taken possession and affords on Seal this day and date first above written

in consideration whereof and in witness for and in consideration of the sum of four dollars in hand paid the receipt whereof
is hereby being acknowledged by the said John Moore hath given granted bargain and sold and do hereby for and give
grant bargain and sell unto the said William Williamson his heirs and assigns forever the following property to wit one negro man named Peter one
mule three head of horses four cows twenty seven head of hogs three peaches bars and furniture eight staves
