 claim of the said Giles Barrett his heirs and assigns and against the claim of all and every person whatsoever shall and will come and offend by these presents the same claims of all of

 for and in consideration of the good and full sum of Fifty dollars to me in hand paid by Ebel  
 a negro woman slave and daughter of the late Jack Coker a free man of colour as well  
 as for other Considerations on this point or owing do hereby manumit and free and discharge from  
 bondage the said Ebel and do by these presents emancipate the said Ebel from this time for  
 her to enjoy the perfect freedom and liberty as far as the laws of this or any other State will  
 extend to her the said Ebel. And I do further more release to her the said Ebel all property which  
 she may have given to her by her decease further as well that which she may hereafter acquire  
 to her and her heirs forever. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal

This Indenture made this 15<sup>th</sup> day of August in the year of our Lord 1724 by and between James Stiggins of  
 Southampton County Virginia of the one part and Ebel Stiggins of the same County and State of the other part touching  
 that for and in consideration of ten hundred dollars to him the said James Stiggins in hand paid by the said Ebel  
 Stiggins and before the signing and delivery of these presents the said James Stiggins for himself or his heirs  
 and assigns had granted bargained sold conveyed and by these presents do give and grant buy and  
 sell alien and assign unto her the said Ebel Stiggins and her heirs and assigns forever a certain tract  
 or parcel of Land lying and being in the town district of St James Parish in the County aforesaid  
 on the west side of the Approp. Swamp containing one hundred and twenty six acres by the same  
 more or less. To have all the tract of Land which I purchased from William L. of the County  
 that part of it which I lately sold and conveyed to Egan Stiggins the said one hundred and  
 twenty six acres of Land being bounded by the Land of the late Benjamin Allen dec'd Henry  
 Gardner and Egan Stiggins to the Approp. Swamp there is a line between the Approp. Swamp to Ebel  
 Stiggins her heirs and assigns. But as to the late Benjamin Stiggins her heirs and assigns and  
 all her heirs and assigns and other appurtenances to the same belonging. It have  
 and to hold the said tract of Land with the appurtenances aforesaid to her the said
