This Indenture made this 2^d day of August 1824 Between George H Gray of the first part and James Rochelle of the second part and Arthur Middleton of the third part of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia Witnesseth that whereas the said James Rochelle hath been known by the said George H Gray in a private or special way bearing date the day of last past for the sum of One hundred dollars made payable to the said James Rochelle and whereas the said George H Gray stands partly indebted to the said James Rochelle in the sum of Ninety four dollars and nine cents due by note on specialty bearing even date with these presents and whereas the said George H Gray stands indebted unto the said James Rochelle as Executor of John Middleton died in the sum of Ninety four dollars and three cents due by note bearing date the 25th day of June 1824 subject to a Credit of fifteen dollars paid on the same day of its date and the said George H Gray being willing and desirous to secure the said James Rochelle (some) (of) (the) (damages) which he may sustain on account of the said debtors as aforesaid as well as to secure to the said James Rochelle in his own individual Capacity as also in the Capacity of Executor as aforesaid This Indenture sheweth that the said George H Gray for and in consideration of the premises aforesaid but more especially for and in consideration of one dollar to him the said George H Gray in hand paid by the said Arthur Middleton the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by the said George H Gray he the said George H Gray hath granted bargained and sold and by these presents doth grant bargain and sell unto the said Arthur Middleton the following property To wit One Negro woman named Jimmy three head and furnished one Bearaw one and a half dozen Wards or Chairs one Mahogany Table one China Table To have and to hold the aforesaid property and every part and parcel thereof unto him the said Arthur Middleton his heirs Executors administrators assigns forever upon this special Trust and Confidence that the said Arthur Middleton his heirs Executors and assigns at the request of the said James Rochelle his heirs Executors and assigns will the aforesaid property or so much thereof as will be sufficient to discharge the debt and interest due on the aforesaid debt first advertising the time and place of sale at least ten days at the Court house door of the County and the surplus of such sales at least ten days at the Court house door of the County and the surplus of such sales after paying and satisfying the debts interest &c as aforesaid pay to the said George H Gray his Executors assigns and the said Arthur Middleton for himself his heirs Executors and assigns Committed and agrees to and with the other parties to these presents that he will execute the Trust and the said George H Gray for himself his heirs Executors and assigns forever warrant and defend the right and title to the aforesaid property and every part and parcel thereof unto him the said Arthur Middleton his heirs Executors and assigns against the claim of all and every person whomsoever In testimony whereof the parties to these presents have hereunto set their hands and affixed their seals the day of Year above written Sign as follows
