This Indenture made the 23<sup>rd</sup> day of January 1822 Between Richard Mueser of Shillanper County  
Virginia of the first part William M. Jones of Spotsylvania County Virginia of the second part and Hardey  
Copp of Stafford County Virginia of the third part Whereas the said Richard Mueser party on the first  
part of the said Hardey Copp on the second part of one thousand seven hundred and some dollars to be paid on the 30<sup>th</sup>  
day of December next ensuing as by bill with legal interest therein appearing the said Richard Mueser a writing  
and demands to secure All his Indenture with bills that he and consideration of the premises as also for and  
in consideration of one dollar to the said Richard Mueser a bond paid by the said William M. Jones at and  
before the executing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged to the said Richard  
Mueser he has granted bargained and sold and as to by these presents granted bargained and sold and conveyed to the  
said William M. Jones his heirs and assigns forever all that land or parcel of Land called and known by the  
name of Little Town tract lying and being in the County of Stafford Virginia and on the West side of  
Blacks Creek River containing four hundred and twenty seven and three fourth acres more or less and  
bounded as follows Beginning at a point on the bank of Black creek near corner of Mrs. Garrison thence out  
to the W. 20 poles to a pine stump to a red oak thence 225 to 122 poles to a pine James Gordons Corner  
thence 209 poles to a long road thence 200 poles to a pine stump thence 200 poles to a  
10 31 poles to a white oak standing on the shore thence around a corner Samuel Daughtry thence of wood  
branch the several courses thereof 220 poles to a marker thence thence out East 9 poles to a pine stump East 8 1/2 poles  
to a red oak thence 20 1/2 poles to a stake thence West 10100 poles to black water then of record thence down  
and round the several courses thereof to the first station Another track calls the person tract containing two  
hundred and some or less adjoining the lands of William M. Jones thence East and about the several courses  
respective and remaining great or other parts of one and a fourth thereof and every part and parcel thereof  
to have and to hold the said parts or parcels of Land with the premises and appurtenances before made  
and unto the said William M. Jones his heirs and assigns forever and the said Richard Mueser for  
himself his heirs Executors and admors do hereby Covenant promise and agree to and with the said
