his wife Robert Goddard for and in consideration of the sum of five thousand four hundred shillings that
paid by the said Thomas Redley as before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof
is hereby acknowledged then grants bargains and sells and by these presents do grant bargain sell
with him the said Thomas Redley his heirs and assigns forever the following plantation tract or parcel
of land containing by recent survey seven hundred and twenty one acres be the same more or less
which said plantation tract and parcel of land was purchased by the said Robert Goddard of Penfance
County of Dorset a decree of the Court passed on the day of December 1523 reference had thereto
and to be the said tract of land with a water Plot Mole sluice attached together with all the profits
Concessions advantages and appurtenances thereto belonging or in any way were appurtenant to the said
Thomas Redley his heirs and assigns forever to the only proper use and behoof of them their heirs
Thomas Redley his heirs and assigns and the said Robert Goddard doth hereby Covenant and
agree with the said Thomas Redley his heirs and assigns for himself his heirs successors and
admirers to warrant and defend the right and title in and to the said land and with against the
claims or demands of all and every person who shall or lawfully by law and under
