This Indenture made this 15<sup>th</sup> day of December in the year of our Lord 1524 Between Robert Godwyn and Margaret his wife the wife of the one part and Thomas Redley of the other part both of the County of Southampton all England that paid by the said Thomas Redley for and in consideration of the sum of five shillings four pence six deniers to him in hand received and acknowledged by them granted bargained and sold and by them presents to grant bargained and sold of land containing by recent survey seven hundred and twenty one acres be the same more or less which said plantation tract and parcel of land was purchased by the said Robert Godwyn of the County of Kent by a decree of the Court of Chancery on the day of December 1523 reference had thereto and to the said tract of land with a water brook with the same attached together with the profits Commodities advantages and appurtenances thereto belonging or in any way appertaining to the said Thomas Redley his heirs and assigns forever to the only proper use and behoof of them the said Thomas Redley his heirs and assigns and the said Robert Godwyn doth hereby covenant and adventure warrant and defend the right and title in and to the said land and with against the claims or demands of all and every person whosoever claiming by through and under him In witness whereof the said Robert Godwyn and Margaret Godwyn his wife have hereunto set their hands and affixed their seals the day and year above written
