This Indenture made and entered into this the 2^d day of March 1825 between John D. Lucas
 Robert his wife of the first part John D. Wilkins of the second part and Weston & Hicks Rebs.
 Borow Esqrs A. Peet Richard M. Cunningham Thomas Nichols & others doth make & conclude
 between the said Lucas and the said Wilkins as far as he the said Baskerville may be bound for the said John D.
 in the premises Esme & Helen and all other just creditors of whatever quantity or degree who shall be entitled
 to the same to the satisfaction and agreement made in this Indenture by writing the same written
 this 27 March 1825 the period of six months from the date of the third part Whereas the said Lucas of the first part has agreed to
 one debt to different individuals for the payment of some part of which some of his friends mentioned
 above as his security while others rest on his individual responsibility alone and with the said Lucas fully
 most truly interested the prompt discharge of all said claims against him and is deeply sensible to the
 full interest of both the honor and legal obligation he has to make every provision for that purpose
 and is therefore willing to convey the whole of his property for their most desirable purpose and after he
 hopes that the property thus to be conveyed may prove entirely adequate to the discharge of the whole
 of the said claims of all the sum there cases in which his friends have no liability or
 responsibility for him without deriving any benefit to themselves thereby and who are now employed
 as his executors or occupying higher grounds in an honorary aspect are being desirous (on the possi-
 ble contingency) of their not being enough to discharge the whole that their his executors with
 William H. Baskerville trustee as aforesaid should be provided for in the first instance O^r in
 this Indenture therfore agree that the said John D. Lucas and Rebecca his wife
 of the first part for and in consideration of the premises and for and in consideration
 of the sum of one dollar to them in hand paid by the said John D. Wilkins of
 the second part before the sealing of this present I have bargained sold given
 and transferred and by these presents to the said John D. Wilkins the following tract or parcels of
 land to wit a certain tract or parcel of land situated on Metherin River where
 it divides the Counties of Southampton and Truroville in this Commonwealth
 one lying partly in those Counties containing about Six hundred and four acres
 be the same more or less subject to the claim of Janet Jones containing one hundred
 acres on the Southampton side the entire tract being required by the said Lucas from
 a certain William Smith. Also a certain other tract or parcel of land lying
 and being situated in the County Necklouing on Cox's Creek acquired of
 Thomas Rose containing five hundred and fifty acres more or less subject to a
 lien given to the said Rose for the purchase thereof also his interest in the lots he
 owns in Springfield together with the remainder and remainder revision
 and revisions rents issues and profits thereof and all and singular the
 tenements hereditaments and appurtenances now or ever belonging to the said
 land and every part and parcel thereof. Also the following slaves to wit, David
 Miller, Hale, Kellen, Ben, Tim, Tom, Abraham, Peck, Lydia, Hannah
 Mary, Cuba and her two children Peter & Willis together with the future issue
 of the females of the said slaves also the entire stock of horses, Cows sheep and
 hogs now in the possession or being the property of the said Lucas also all the
 house hold and kitchen furniture with the carriage and harness, gigs and
 harness bridle and saddle harness tools and implements of husbandry which
 the said Lucas at present owns together with all out standing debts and
 to the said Lucas and his executors of every description that may be made on the above
 tracts or parcels of land the present year to the said John D. Wilkins of the second part

To have and to hold the said tracts or parcels of land with all and singular the
 premises above described or otherwise to be conveyed and all the said slaves and the
 personal property or debts aforesaid together with the library, medicine and shop furniture
 of said Lucas not before mentioned to the said John D. Wilkins his heirs and affi-
 cessors or administrators forever In Trust nevertheless and for the following
 uses and purposes to wit That the said Wilkins is immediately the entire
