This Indenture made and executed this 18th day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty four between Lewis Williams of the County of Southampton the son and heir of John Williams deceased and John Williams formerly of the County of Southampton of the other part (Witnesseth) that the said Lewis Williams for and in consideration of the natural love and affection which I bear for and towards my aforesaid children as well for and in consideration of the sum of one pound ten

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shillings and pence by them as you grand to them the following property to wit to my son John Williams I lend the following property First megamum Pat. Woman Enny and Pat. Hally with their future success which my son

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Matthew is to manage for him and apply the same and other dividend arising from the said two negroes to his use and for his benefit and towards his support and support on the same way as he could or might do were he an owner

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and his heirs To my daughter Mary Coll. form my Williams and to her children except Lewis Eggar the following property to them and their heirs forever to wit Deas Glee and her future success To my grandson the aforesaid Lewis Coll. Eggar one negro man Phanton which he is to receive at my death and one boy of his father to him and his heirs forever To my daughter Maacha Harwick formerly Williams and to her children I give the following property First three negroes namely Sam. George and Sophamus to them and their heirs forever To my son Richard Williams I give the following property to wit megamum named John Henry Goldsch to him and his heirs forever To my son Matthew Williams I give the following property namely negro man named Oble Mingo woman Amy Man Moses and John and the future success of Mary to him and his heirs forever To my daughter Sally Mathington formerly Williams and to her children I give the following property namely negro man Dary Woman Muggy and Mary to them and their heirs forever Sales go to my said son John Williams on bed and furniture to him and his heirs forever Sales go and in consideration of the love and affection which I bear to my said son John Richard and Matthew as well for and in consideration of one dollar to me in Land paid the receipt whereof I do hereby acknowledge as you to them the tract of Land between Shaw Lane containing by estimation the hundred and twenty five acres

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reserving to myself the use and profits and present of the said Land during my life and then to go to my said son John to them and their heirs forever each to have 1/3rd and the 2/3rd part for Matthew and the 1/3rd part for Richard and no difference to be paid. Sales go and in consideration of the circumstances aforesaid as you unto my said children namely Mary Maacha Richard Matthew and Sally except my Stock of Cattle Hogs Sheep home hold and kitchen furniture to be equally divided between them reserving to myself the use and profits and other advantages arising therefrom during my life and then to my said children as last mentioned to them and their heirs forever In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affix my seal the day and year first written
