This Indenture made and granted This 15th day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and
forty five by Lewis Williams of the County of Southampton of the on board Ship William Grey Col from New York
and Martha Hancock formerly Williams Richard Williams Matthew Williams and Polly Washington formerly Williams all
of the County of Southampton wife of the said William Grey Col from New York
and John Williams son of the said Lewis Williams for and consideration of the sum of one hundred
and twenty dollars paid by them do give grant to them the following property to wit to my son John Williams I leave the
following property trust my son John George and Polly with their future increase who being son
Matthew is to manage for him and apply the same and other sum and money from the said to my son John Williams
and for his benefit and to cause his comfort and support on the same way as he calls or might be seen he in a
proper situation to manage for himself and at his death the said Negro I give to my son Matthew Williams
and his heirs To my daughter Dolly Col from my Williams and to her children except her son John the fellow
my property to them and their heirs forever to all Dolly Col and her future success To my Grandson the
aforenamed Lewis Col I give one negro man Brant which he is to receive at my death and one lot of furniture
to him and his heirs forever To my Daughter Martha Hancock formerly Williams and to her children I give the
following property trust this my son John George and Daphne to them and their heirs forever I also give
To my son Richard Williams I give the following property trust negro man named Peter Henry gift
To him and his heirs forever To my son Matthew Williams I give the following property namely negro man
named Will Morgan woman Amy Mann Rose and John and the future increase of Amy to him and
his heirs forever To my daughter Dolly Washington formerly Williams and to her children I give the following
property namely Negro man Peter Henry woman Maggie and Mary to them and their heirs forever I also give
to my said son John Williams one bed and furniture to him and his heirs forever I also hereby acknowledge do give to
them the half of Land wherein I now live containing by estimation the hundred and twenty four acres
reserving to myself the use and profit and proceeds of the said Land during my life and then to go to
my said son John Williams to them and their heirs forever each to have 1/2 share the same part for Matthew and
the portion for Richard and no difference to be paid I also for and in consideration of the circumstances
aforesaid do give unto my two children namely Dolly Martha Richard Matthew and Polly above
my Stock of Cattle Hogs Sheep hens hild and Kitchen furniture to be equally apportioned between them
leaving to myself the use and profits and other advantages among themselves during my life and then to my
said children as last mentioned to them and their heirs forever In witness whereof I have written at my
hand and affixed my seal the day and year first written
