of the County of Spotsylvania and State of Virginia of the one part and Charles A. Bailey of the County of Southampton of the other part  
Witnesseth that in their said Indenture for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars to him in hand paid by the said Charles  
Bailey the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by the said Thomas Norman hereinafter granted and to be the said Thomas Norman  
and his heirs forever a certain tract or parcel of land situate lying and being within the County  
of Southampton on the South side of Fort's road containing twenty acres more or less bounded as follows beginning at Fort's Road then to  
South Eastwardly to a White Oak then to a red oak for an angle thence to a White Oak for an angle thence to the head of a small  
Creek thence to a White Oak for an angle thence to a small person made in the corner of a red oak that is named for and of  
thence to a pond common James States land thence easterly to a Short Oak near the road thence to a red oak Road  
to Fort's Road again thence up Fort's Road to the beginning to have and to hold the said tract or parcel of land with all the
