This Indenture made this day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and  
thirty four between Benjamin Johnson of the one part and Giles Johnson of the other, both to have the  
Copy of certain other parts of Southampton and State of Virginia Intelligible land the said Benjamin Johnson  
underwriting of the love and affection and also for the further consideration of the sum of thirty dollars  
of lawful money of the Commonwealth to have and to hold, paid by the said Giles Johnson above before  
the concluding and delivery of these presents, she except whereof he hereby acknowledges have received  
and by her presents doth bargain and sell unto the said Giles Johnson his heirs and assigns a certain  
tract of land lying and being in the County and parish aforesaid containing by estimation thus  
there are to be three hundred and six and one half acres by the lands of Joseph Warren, John Johnson, George  
and William Pittman and others and Giles Johnson to the said tract of land being held  
and more fully agreed together with all and singular the houses buildings of every kind  
motes and water courses profits committments franchises and appurtenances unto the said land  
belonging or in any wise appertaining to the same or any part or parcel thereof to have and to be  
the same truly the acre of land which are and designate the premises herein before mentioned or  
intended to be so much every part and parcel thereof unto the said Giles Johnson his heirs and  
assigns forever to and for the use and benefit of him the said Giles Johnson his heirs and  
forever and the said Benjamin Johnson his heirs and assigns and from all and every other person  
or persons whatsoever claim the same or any part thereof shall and will warrant and forever  
defend by these presents In witness whereof the said Benjamin Johnson has hereunto set his hand  
and affixed his seal the day and date written
