Blon stands greatly indebted unto the said James Middlesex Esq<sup>r</sup> for his labor and service done to him in the purchase of his land and the sum of one hundred dollars due him to pay unto him specially created and made payable to John Underwood in his life time which note or specially bears date the 20<sup>th</sup> day of November 1823 and payable on demand and the said John T. Blon being willing and desirous to secure the payment of the aforesaid debt interest and costs have granted bargained and sold and by these presents doth grant bargain and sell unto the said Aaron Madelton his heirs and assigns forever one certain tract or parcel of land containing 15 1/2 acres of land which the said John T. Blon to now professes of to have and to hold the aforesaid property unto the said Aaron Madelton and to his heirs and assigns forever upon his great trust and confidence that the said Aaron Madelton his heirs executors and administrators shall always stand at the request of the said James Richelle make sale of the aforesaid property or so much thereof as may be sufficient to pay and discharge the aforesaid debt interest and costs after having given them full notice of the time and place of sale and the surplus of any sale pay over to the said John T.
