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Mr. Lawrence Cook and Jacob Barnes Testimony of the cause for the
 (Com^y) of Southampton pronounced by Justice Clegg that. Marin A. Everett, Esq^r of William P. Everett,
 parties to the said suit announced and bearing date the 17th day of December 1821, brought his suit against the said
 town or formerly appears before us in this County of Southampton and being examined upon his
 behalf from his knowledge after having fully explained to her the acknowledgment of the same
 he recited and said that he had recently applied to said Esq^r Scales and desired the same and made
 not to retreat from it given under our hands and sealed this 5th day of November 1824

This Indenture entered into the 18th September 1824 between Richard Hampton of the first part
 and Benjamin Harrison of the said part witnesseth that whereas the said Benjamin Harrison having become the owner of the
 said Richard Hampton's a bond recited by him to John M. Chapman the sum of one hundred dollars payable
 demand and the said Richard wishing to indemnify said Chapman the said Benjamin for any encumbrance of
 the premises and also for his non payment of one dollar to himen being paid by the said David Spalding had
 given quitclaim and by other parts as hereinafter bargained and sold to the said Richard Hampton his heirs and assigns
 for all the Stock of Corn, Cotton &c all the growing Crop of Corn, Cotton and all other Crops of the kind
 yearly growing which have been taken in within one month past from which he occupies to have and to hold the
 same in the manner by them the said Richard herein after mentioned, set forth herin above named and agreed
 to sell from the said Benjamin to take payment of and receive the sole management over the same during the continuance
 of the said Richard and until the Crop shall be harvested at that time will upon the request of the said Benjamin all
 the same or credit on for such as is necessary may have best and out of the proceeds pay the said debt to John M. Chapman
 provided the same be then due or make such arrangement as may be agreeable to all parties and the balance going
 payable the said Richard Hampton and the said Benjamin equally to manage the same so intended to be done
 to his mind and to clear to the said Richard his right upon the effects of this Indenture being accomplished by him
 whereof the parties have executed set their hands and seals the day and year above written.

 hold the said Rose, Cast and Groat to him the said Hampton Parker and his assigns forever. Upon the following
 tenth day of January that whereas I the said Patrick Somerton am indebted to Henry Gardner the sum of
 twenty five dollars as appears by my note unexecuted bearing date the 3rd day of December 1824. Now that
 of the said Patrick Somerton do owe him and to satisfy and fully discharge the aforesaid note of twenty
 five dollars with a growing interest on before the 15th day of May next ensuing the day being the tenth
