The Indenture made the 7th day of Oct. co. 18th. between Cordale Brantley of the first part & John P. Briggs of the same part and Abner Benjamin Elder of the third part all of the County of Washington and State of Virginia Whereas William Cordale Brantley stands indebted to Charles W. Goodenough in the sum of twenty eight dollars and fifty cents and the said Abner Benjamin Elder becoming security for the fulfillment of bond and also the said Cordale Brantley stands indebted to the said Charles W. Goodenough Gen. Ld. in the sum of eighty dollars and he said Elder being liable to the original bond included therein was sued brought to Ct. Va. Co. No. 10 Justice said Cordale Brantley having refused and declining to redeem the said Abner Benjamin Elder from his legal obligation which he might sustain as security for the aforesaid Cordale Brantley also for the further satisfaction of the sum of one dollar and eleven pence by the said Charles W. Briggs the receipt whereof the said Cordale Brantley or his agent acknowledged granted bargained and sold unto the said Charles W. Briggs as aforesaid one negro man named Peggy with him the said Charles W. Briggs her hair dress adornment and apparel former trunk cover shawl skirt etc. it was thus entered and concerning official presents what the said Charles W. Briggs shall at any time after judgment after giving ten days notice at the Court house above if the County either at request of the said Abner Benjamin Elder or the said Cordale Brantley express to take the aforesaid negro woman and of the money arising from such sale pay and satisfy the aforesaid debt interest and all other costs which may accrue thereon then the Chief Magistrate and Clerk the expenses of any process to the said Cordale Brantley or such persons as he may authorize In witness whereof he put his hand person to have hereunto set their hands and seals the day and date above written
