This Indenture made this 24<sup>th</sup> October in the year of our Lord Christ one thousand eight hundred and  
and twenty four between James Rockelle and Martha his wife of the County of Surry parishes of the one part and  
Sarah Rose of the same County of the other part witnesseth that the said James Rockelle and Martha his  
wife for and consideration of the sum of twenty six hundred dollars Current money of Virginia to them in  
hand paid the receipt whereof they do hereby acknowledge their grantees hereinafter and solemly enforfe  
and Conferre and by these presents doth grant, bargan and sell alene enforfe and Conferre unto the said  
Samuel Little and his heirs and assigns forever all that tract or parcel of Land situated lying and lying  
in the County of Surry in a place called West Side of the Apameacock Swamp and bounded as follows to wit begin  
ing at a live oak on the West Side of the Apameacock Swamp a corner of Land at Butts lane thence along  
the said line West by North three hundred and thirty pole to a tree on a corner tree of Daniel Butts aforesaid  
hence thence due South two hundred pole to a red oak between a corner tree of Charles Johnson thence  
East by South three hundred and forty pole to the East side of the Apameacock Swamp  
aforesaid thence up the various courses of the run of the said Swamp to the beginning containing by a late  
Survey four hundred and thirty three acres more or less which land is now or late called East Land and solemly  
conveyed to certain William Pitts by the last will and testamet of his father Peter Pitts and aforesaid purchased  
by the said John Pitts of Pitts House and by the said Pitts House of Peabody Collected by the  
said Captain William Pitts now of Surry County and by the said Johnson of the chief man of the maturing  
Indian nation and which said Pitts did by him purchase of the said William Pitts by William Pitts  
and by the said William Pitts sold given and Conveyed by and to his daughter Martha now the aforesaid  
Martha Rockelle wife of the said James Rockelle to have and to hold the aforesaid tract or parcel of  
Land with all manner and manner buildings and houses lands woods waters and advantages whatsoever  
ever to the said Land and premises in anywise appertaining and also all the tithes right tithes  
and rents and dues and whatsoever else to and to the same to the said Samuel Little his  
heirs and assigns forever and the said James Rockelle and Martha his wife for themselves their  
heirs to the said land and premises with the appurtenances to the said Samuel Little his heirs and assigns  
against whom the said James Rockelle and Martha his wife and their heirs and against all and every  
person or persons who ever shall and will remain and forever defend by these presents Interfere  
whereof the said James Rockelle and Martha his wife have caused at their houses own office her  
Seal the day and year first above written
