Witnesseeth that the 22<sup>nd</sup> day of December 1834 between Sep'r. A. Hale of the first part and M. B. Roman of the second part and Samuel Blunt of the third part witnesseth that whereas the said Hale & Hale of the first part to partly make to the said Samuel Blunt of the third part with sum of Five hundred dollars by him received by him the said Hale and a certain Peter Rose bearing date with these presents and being anxious to secure the payment of the same from the said John A. Hale and in consideration of the premises and for another and further Consideration of one to him to be given paid by the said M. B. Roman had and doth grantis bargained and sold and by these presents doth grant bargain and sell unto the said M. B. Roman the following property situate near Pittsford Range for aforesaid use. Fifty Acres Eighteen Rods of Cattle forty head of Cows Impounded and from time to time looking Geese four tables of glass and Crockery ward of every description one dozen large Silver Table Spoons half dozen Tea Spoons silver four bushel iron trough one bushel Buffet four framed pictures eighteen Inch Cotton chairs Horse Cart and wheel one big heavy carriage one Grand Piano two sets of fine furniture white Corn & Horn of Glass whale oil Lamp Candle sticks four complete by armories flying from one. Both tables sets of fine wine glasses plates sea plough tool set and four brass chands for candle fire lighting two iron ingot boxes saddle of Bridle together with all other his Time Linen and Kitchen Furniture to him and his heirs forever upon special trust nevertheless as the said Blunt hereinafter conveys and agreed of his and the said M. B. Roman and the said Hale and agreed that he will permit the said Blunt to remain in possession of the above named property until he shall be necessary for him to use the same for the purpose herein after mentioned yet that so after the 1<sup>st</sup> day of January 1835 as he may be satisfied by the said Samuel Blunt and L. Hale sign off his name by affidavit and to the said M. B. Roman his wife for giving reasonable notice of the time and place of sale etc then above conveyed property to him to the highest bidder for cash or on such credit as the said Blunt shall insist and after paying all costs & charges for sale pay the debt aforesaid to the said Blunt of the said proceeds shall be sufficient and the balance of any return to the said Hale and the said Samuel Blunt.
