fifty dollars to them and paid the receipt whereof is here acknowledged hath granted bargained sold given and
assigned unto Eleazar Soper a tract of land lying and being in the County of Southampton containing forty two acres more
or less being the same tract piece or parcel of land a division of the old plantation by his wife to his daughter Ruth
Kearns son the aforesaid Martha Williams reference being had to the testament and last will of the aforesaid Jacob
Barlow and the report of the survey of the aforesaid land in pursuance of the will of the said Jacob Barlow which
of Southampton County bears record of the boundaries and description of the aforesaid land premises and
more fully appear to have made to the aforesaid tract or parcel of land containing forty two acres more
or less with all and singular the appurtenances thereunto belonging or in any way appertaining whole house or how
ever wattle and wattle houses yards gardens and orchards the appurtenances thereto belonging unto him to the
said Eleazar Soper his heirs and assigns forever and the said William Williams and Martha his wife formerly known
as Ruth Kearns daughter and widow of Jacob Barlow died for themselves their and each of their heirs and assigns
