This Indian made this 27th day of February 1855 before Mevius King of the County of Embury of the one part and Frank Bray of the said County of the other part testimony that for and in consideration of the sum of twenty five dollars to me and paid the receipt whereof is being acknowledged, sold, granted, bargained, sold and Conformed unto the said Eighth May in certain tract of land lying and being unto the Count of Embury and known as follows to wit by the lands of William Williamson on the north, west and by the lands of John Thomas on the south and west. Commencing by a line to the north, we are to be the same more or less with all benefits and improvements thereunto belonging which said land I warrant and forever defend the title of the said King and his Heirs forever against the Claims of every person whatsoever in the within whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the day and date above written signed sealed and
