This Indenture made this 4th day of February in the year of our Lord 1825 by and between Jonathan Linder of the County of Southampton and state of Virginia and on the one part Attorney of the one part and Joseph Hargis of the same County state and parcel of the other part Witness that the said Jonathan Linder for and in consideration of the sum of three hundred and sixteen good and lawful money of Virginia to him hereunto paid by the said Joseph Hargis the receipt whereof the said Jonathan Linder doth acknowledge himself fully well satisfied and paid shall grant and bargain sell aliened enfeoffed and Convey unto the said Joseph Hargis to him and to his heirs forever one certain tract parcel of Land and premises known by the proper name and name of the said Henry Bishop and being in the County state and of part of a parcel containing twenty seven acres and being more or less as follows to wit beginning at a post oak a corner between John Lawrence's estate land thence at 61 1/2 ft to a light house post in John Lawrence's line thence at 72 1/2 ft to a pine standing in the head of a small branch thence along the said branch the various courses thereof to the road leading from Cary's bridge to the black water bridge thence down the road at 55 1/2 ft to a red oak a corner from Cary's bridge to the black water bridge thence at 53 1/2 ft to a pine a corner with the said John Lawrence's line thence at 74 1/2 ft to a pine a corner in Cornet's Corner with the line standing in the head of a small branch thence down the run of said branch the various courses thereof to a red pine head of a small branch thence down the run of said branch the various courses thereof to a red pine a corner of the said John Lawrence's estate lands and Cornet's Corner thence at 53 1/2 ft to the first station together with all houses out houses Expensive buildings Cattle Pens and such other ways and roads and other Courses in whatever belonging or manner appurtenant
