This Indenture, made the 28<sup>th</sup> day of January, in the year of our Lord 1825, between Henry Harp, James C. H. Foster and Arthur Williamson the one part, and James C. H. Foster and Arthur Williamson the other part, of and by the said Henry Harp, James C. H. Foster and Arthur Williamson, Comproisers, appeared for and in confirmation of the sum of thirteen hundred and twenty five dollars lawful money of Virginia to them in hand paid by the said David James, the receipt whereof having acknowledged the said Henry Harp, James C. H. Foster and Arthur Williamson, Comproisers names in this were affixed, have bargained to and covenanted, conveyed and agreed to, together present or to acquire full slave Country and Covenanted said James his heirs and assigns forever all that parcel or tract of land lying situate in the County of Southampton now and on the north side of the three Acre Containing by situation three Acres and five acres of ground, subject to the several rights to be the same more or less and is bounded back and north by Thomas Griffiths to him and by the Pygones and bounded by James and his heirs forever the heads of being the the same formerly belonging to the said Joseph Pygones together with all and singular the appurtenances thereto in anywise to have and to hold the said tract or parcel of land and all and singular the premises hereby bargained and sold or mentioned to be sold with them and every of their heirs and assignances unto the said David James his heirs and assigns to the only proper use and behoof of them the said David James his heirs and assigns forever and the said Henry Harp, James C. H. Foster and Arthur Williamson Comproisers well warrant and forever defend the above said tract of land and premises therein to the said James his heirs and assigns forever. In witness whereof the said Henry Harp, James C. H. Foster and Arthur Williamson and Comproisers have hereunto set their hands and affixed their seals the day and date above written.
