This Indenture made and entered into this 21 day of February in the year of our Lord 1825 between James Parker and his wife of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the first part and Stephen T. Iape of the same County and State of the other part witnesseth that the said James Parker and Nancy R. his wife for and consideration of the sum of one hundred dollars given him in hand paid by the said Augustine T. Iape at or before the executing and delivery of this present the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged to have been witnessed to and by them present and either of them doth bargained and sold unto the said Stephen new property his and aforesaid a certain parcel of land lying and being within the said County and bounded as follows to wit beginning at a corner point on James Howell's line thence along a line of bounded trees between Robert & Parker's and James Parker's line to a corner tree a said tree standing in the west part thereof. Now to whom the various courses of the several branches to the mouth of the Pond branch to the first beginning which said boundaries shall continue for ever and one fourth acre of land more or less together with all the Conveniences appendages and appurtenances whatsoever to the said land belonging or appertaining and the necessary rentmills remainder and conveniences rents and profits thereof to have and to hold the said tract of land and every part thereof unto the said Augustine T. Iape his heirs and assigns forever to and for the sole use and benefit of him the said Augustine T. Iape his heirs and assigns forever and the said James Parker and Nancy R. his wife for themselves and their heirs the said tract for and one fourth acre of land and all its appurtenances unto the said Augustine T. Iape his heirs and assigns from the day or days of them the said James Parker and his wife or either of them their heirs or their heirs and of all and every person or persons whatsoever shall use and soever and as often as he may be thereto entituled by these presents.
